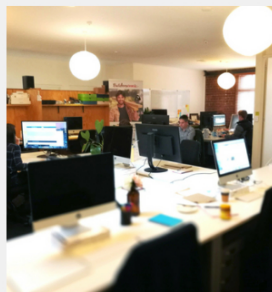


Navigating Wet Lawns - One Family's Solution
